NEW IN 2023

NEW STAFF



Red Hook Responds had significant staffing changes in 2023, which saw the transition from full-time Interim Executive Director, Nevill Smythe, to two new part-time staff, Executive Director, Bianca Verrilli and Volunteer Coordinator, Madison Curry.

Additionally, volunteer chef Leslie Pulver, joined the team as Executive Chef, ensuring RHR meals meet high standards. This new staffing structure is more sustainable and better meets our long-term needs.

NEW BACKPACK PROGRAM

In the fall of 2023, Red Hook Responds assumed the management of the BackPack Program of Red Hook High School and Linden Avenue Middle School. This program was previously under the administration of the community group, Red Hook Harvest.





This program of the <u>Regional Food Bank of</u>
<u>Eastern NY</u> is funded by the <u>Ascienzo</u>
<u>Family Foundation</u> and <u>Red Hook Rotary</u>

and aims to alleviate child hunger by providing nutritious meals to students during weekends and school breaks.

COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENT

In 2023, the <u>Red Hook Community Center</u> and Red Hook Responds commissioned Hudson Valley Pattern for Progress to conduct a needs assessment for the communities of Red Hook and Rhinebeck. <u>The assessment</u> identifies key community needs and provides recommendations for addressing those needs.


DINNER DELIVERY



Through our Dinner Delivery program Red Hook Responds delivers chef-made meals to households in the Red Hook and Rhinebeck school districts, providing dinners 7 days a week. This is our most requested program, with an average of **700** dinners served per month and a total of **8,483** meals delivered in 2023.



Meals delivered by location





The Dinner Delivery program provides vital support to individuals and families facing food insecurity. There are no eligibility requirements for this service and a majority of dinner requesters are senior citizens.

LOCAL FOOD EXCHANGE

The Local Food Exchange is a micro-food bank through which Red Hook Responds receives donations of perishable and non-perishable food and personal hygiene products. These donations are then distributed to local food pantries. Red Hook Responds leverages our refrigerated, frozen, and dry goods storage spaces to store these items until they are ready for use by the food pantries.



In 2023 the Local Food
Exchange received over
11,300 pounds of produce
from Migliorelli Farm and
Four Corners Community
Farm and nearly 2,500
loaves of bread from
Bread Alone Bakery.



The Local Food Exchange decreases food waste, simplifies coordination between product donors and recipient organizations, and ensures that donated products are distributed where they are most needed, while bringing healthy, local foods to our community.

VEGGIE TABLES

Each spring, Red Hook Responds in partnership with <u>Bard College Farm</u>, distributes raised garden beds with soil and seedlings to participant homes. These garden beds serve as a source of fresh vegetables over the course of the growing season and allow participants who would otherwise not be able to enjoy the activity of gardening to have the opportunity to care for their own garden while enjoying the fruits (and veggies) of their labor.



RED HOOK BACKPACK PROGRAM

Through the <u>BackPack program</u>, Red Hook Responds delivers food pantry boxes to the households of participating students of Red Hook High School and Linden Avenue Middle School on a monthly basis.




Although free and reduced breakfast and lunch programs provide significant nutritional benefits to students during the school day, some children do not have access to regular meals when school is not in session, and these BackPack Program deliveries provide access to healthy foods outside of school.

HELPLINE

Our Helpline is staffed by a volunteer operator between 9am and 4pm every day. Helpline operators assist callers in signing up for Red Hook Responds services and, where additional assistance is needed, the operators direct callers to other resources.

In a digital world, the Helpline complements the Red Hook Responds website, making it easy for community members without access to a computer or reliable internet connection to request our services or ask for help.

In 2023 the Helpline received an average of **84 calls per month**.



NEIGHBORLY CHATS

Through the Neighborly Chats program, a Red Hook Responds volunteer calls the participant via phone for a friendly chat. Program participants largely live alone and experience social isolation and therefore appreciate connection and friendly conversation with a volunteer on a weekly basis.

In 2023, our volunteers made an average of **22 Neighborly Chat calls per month,** totaling **262 calls for the year**. Neighborly Chats are available to anyone in the the community who requests one.


FOOD PANTRY BAG, PHARMACY & GROCERY DELIVERY

In partnership with the Red Hook branch of the Community Action Partnership for Dutchess County, we deliver food pantry bags to residents who request one.



Through our Grocery and Pharmacy Delivery programs, our volunteers pick up grocery and pharmacy orders and deliver them to requesters' homes.

In 2023 RHR volunteers delivered a total of **88 grocery, 63 pharmacy,** and **44 food pantry bag deliveries**.



These programs are frequently used by members of our community who are without transportation, are unable to drive, and who do not have a family member or caretaker to support them with these activities.


OUR VOLUNTEERS



Volunteers are the heart and soul of Red Hook Responds. Without volunteers RHR's programs would not be possible. In 2023, we were fortunate to have an average of **49 active volunteers per month** who contributed a total of **5,026.5 hours of service** — an average of **418**

volunteer hours per month!

Our volunteers help in many ways, and they report high levels of satisfaction with their volunteer experiences. In 2023 we streamlined the volunteer onboarding experience and improved volunteer resources.





OUR FINANCES


INCOME
